There's an issue

Every day, people across the country struggle to build better lives for themselves and their families. These challenges are fueled by serious social and economic barriers that include poverty, youth unemployment and community decline, among others, making it remarkably difficult to get ahead.

1 in 10 Canadians live in poverty.

13%: The national unemployment rate for youth aged 15-24—almost twice the rate of working-age adults.

1 in 5 Canadians live with a mental illness.

There's a way forward

United Way is committed to helping people and families across Canada build better lives—both today and tomorrow. We do this by moving people from poverty to possibility, helping kids be all they can be, and building strong and healthy communities.

\$5 provides one meal to someone who is homeless, giving them refuge in a safe environment.

\$260 provides 10 people with 10 weeks of programming on how to support a family member or friend struggling with mental illness.

\$400 covers one week of work experience wages for a young person in an employment program.

\$800 helps bring together 100 neighbours to identify common challenges and solutions, making their community stronger and safer.

\$1,200 provides important household items to six families, helping them make a life-changing move to secure housing.

But, there are barriers

Social and economic challenges like poverty, youth unemployment and isolation are issues that affect all of us. They widen gaps between those who are doing well financially and those who are not, and threaten the strong social fabric that is vital to healthy, connected communities.

Nearly 1/5 of Canadian seniors report that they feel lonely.

\$7 billion: the cost of homelessness to the Canadian economy each year.

Less than 1 in 4 Canadian children and youth in need of mental health support actually receive it.

There's an issue

Social issues do not discriminate; any of us could experience a crisis that will change our life dramatically. Thousands of people are facing challenges in Waterloo Region and living without adequate housing, food, income, health, and wellbeing.

1 in 10 people in Waterloo Region live in poverty.

Nearly **1 in 4** adults in Waterloo Region fall in the lowest levels of literacy.

1 in 10 young people between the ages of 15 and 19 in Waterloo Region report experiencing "quite a lot" of life stress. Death by suicide is the second leading cause of death for youth.

There's a way forward

United Way Waterloo Region Communities is dedicated to helping people live better lives. We are fundraisers who support a network of agencies that are locally focused, informed, and deeply invested in helping people reach their full potential.

\$8 provides an individual with emergency food and skills so they can better meet their needs.

\$400 gives 11 people the opportunity to build supportive relationships with their peers, reducing their social isolation.

\$800 connects 17 neighbours to their community, providing volunteer opportunities and leadership development.

\$1,200 provides 22 children & youth with key mentorship and leadership development opportunities.

But, there are barriers

Homelessness is not caused by drug addiction. Hunger is not caused by poor budgeting. Loneliness is not caused by failure to participate. It can be a combination of many issues that contribute to the challenges people face.

1 in 5 youth in Waterloo Region won't graduate from high school. High school graduation rates in Waterloo Region are approximately 4 points lower than the provincial average.

1 in 20 households in Waterloo Region experience hunger. **1 in 3** food bank users are children under the age of 13.

1 in 3 people lack a sense of belonging in Waterloo Region.

United Way Waterloo Region Communities invests in programs and services that deliver community-wide benefits. Our investments include everything from emergency food and shelter services that meet basic needs; to counselling and harm reduction programs that help people live healthier lives; to after-school and mentorship activities that give vulnerable youth a chance at a better future.

\$5.2M is invested throughout Waterloo Region.

79 programs & initiatives delivered by **47** Partner Agencies, including those that work together as a part of 8 collaborative networks.

359,574 individuals served across Waterloo Region.
