

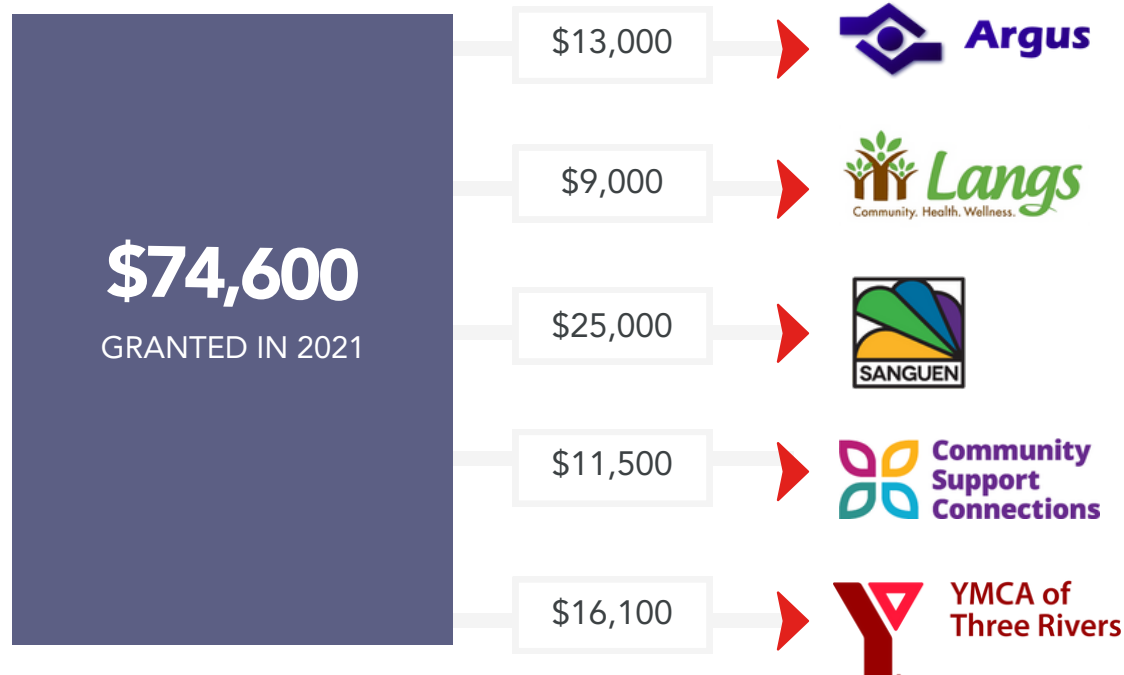
COVID-19 Community Response Fund



The pandemic disproportionately impacted certain populations and our goal was to raise funds for programs and services that directly benefited these individuals. The COVID-19 Community Response Fund, directly supported frontline organizations, particularly those that aren't always visible in our community but continue to provide critical support for the most vulnerable members in Waterloo Region.

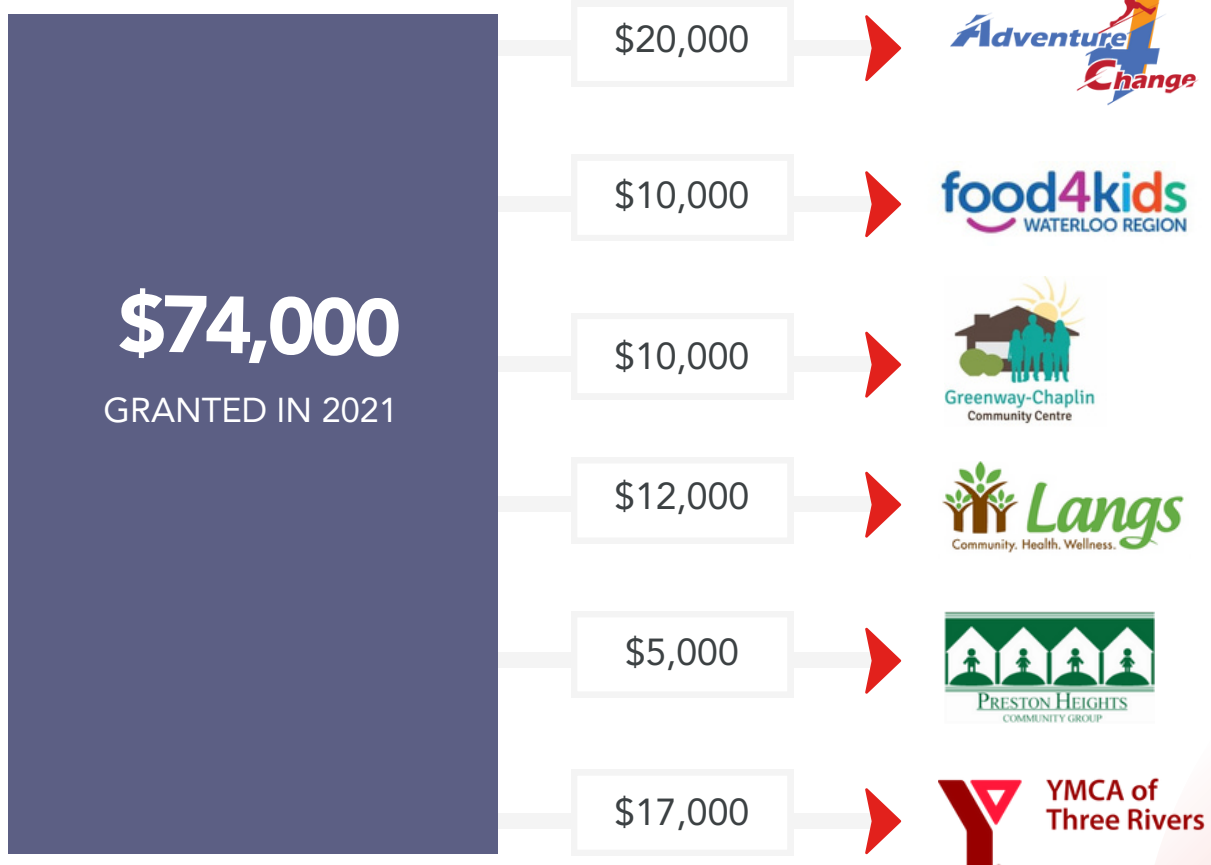

Children & Youth Summer Survival Fund



This fund was created to help ensure more young people in Waterloo Region have access to programs and services to help them thrive after more than a year of unprecedented challenges from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ending Isolation Fund



In a community that is growing every day, it seems unlikely that there are people who are not benefitting from that progress. In reality, thousands of people are being left behind in Waterloo Region and living without adequate housing, food, income, health, and wellbeing. The Ending Isolation Fund provided much needed funding to local programs, services, and initiatives that work toward ensuring no one is struggling on their own.

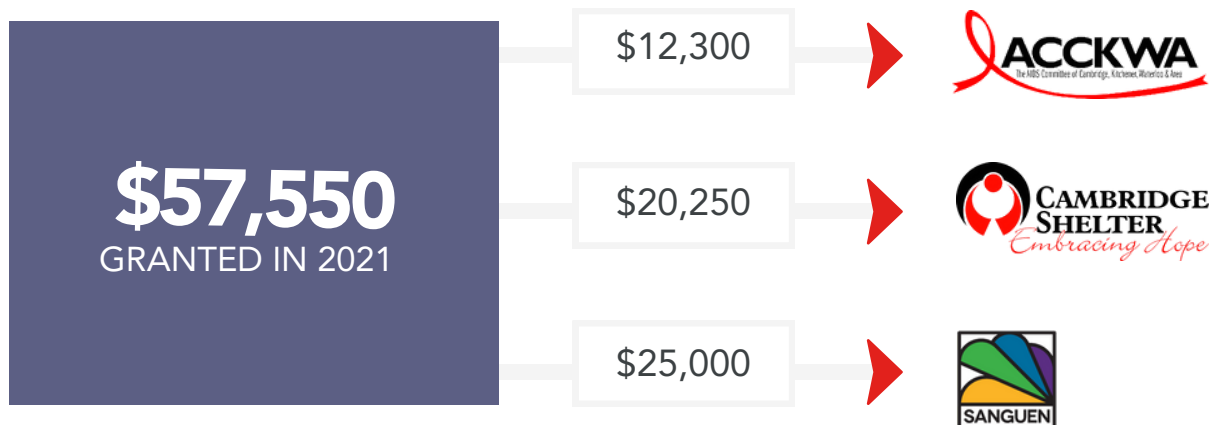
Addressing Addiction & the Opioid Crisis



Drug use is not new to our community. Nor is it a problem that affects only a subset of the population. It is a problem in our community for people of all walks of life and ages. Because opioids are prescribed drugs, it can happen to anyone. Opioid use is a serious problem that crosses socioeconomic status, culture and age and we have seen a dramatic increase in the usage of prescription drugs in Waterloo Region.

Holiday Initiative: Preventing Homelessness

In 2021, the preventing homelessness fund was created over the holidays to support programs and services helping people who are homeless or are at risk of becoming homeless.

Approximately \$120,000 was raised to support critical services.



Giving Tuesday: Mental Health Supports

Each quarter in our funding cycle, United Way WRC provides support to mental health initiatives across the community.

Funds raised on Giving Tuesday allowed us to shine a spotlight on this issue & raise an additional \$38,000 to support mental health programs across Waterloo Region.



Endowment Funds

United Way WR has established endowment funds with the Kitchener Waterloo Community Foundation and the Cambridge North Dumfries Community Foundation. These funds provide needed operation support to local agencies for critical programs.

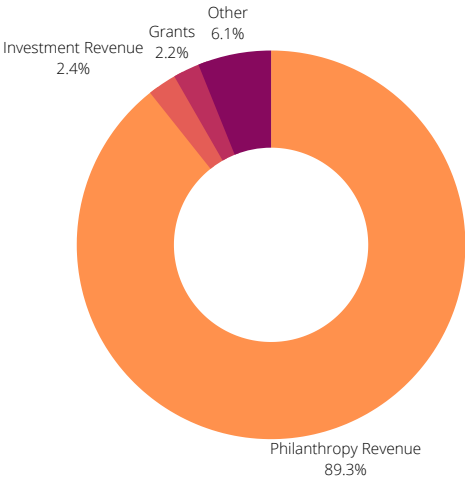

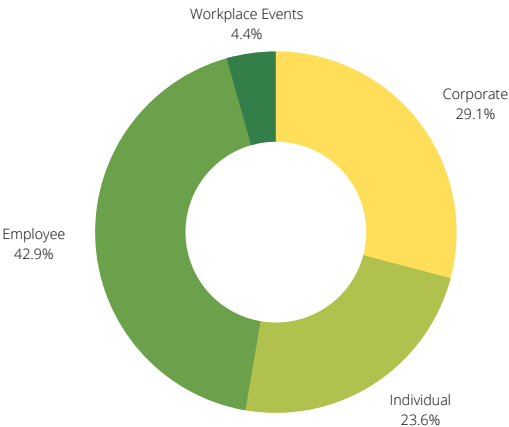

Philanthropy Revenue Streams



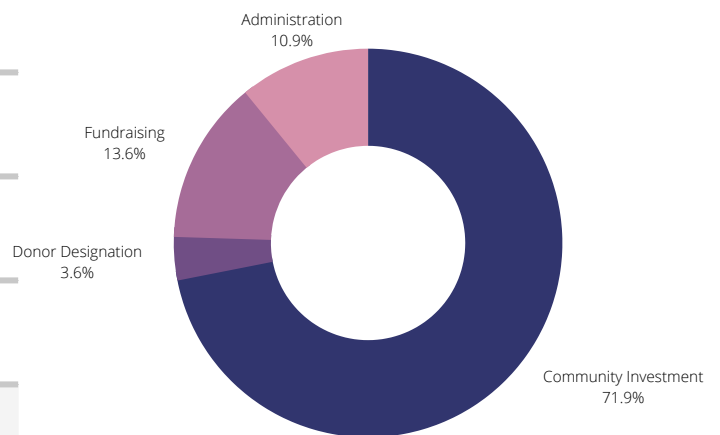

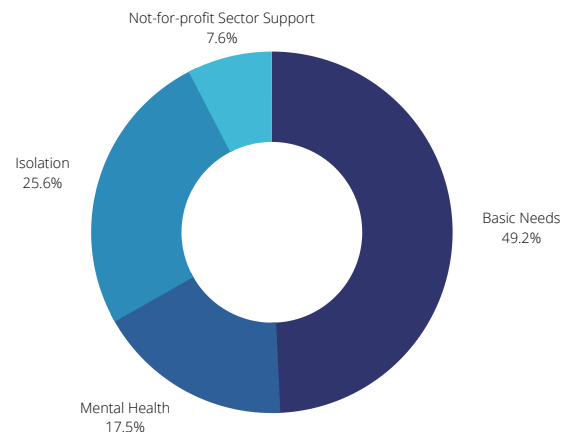
Expenditures by percentage

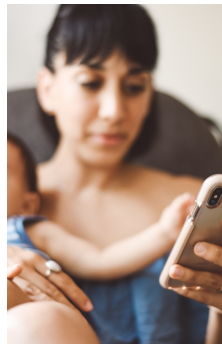
