<u>United Way Waterloo Region Communities distributes \$718,871 through the</u> <u>General Community Fund.</u>

Funding to support 55 local agencies and programs

Waterloo Region – United Way Waterloo Region Communities (UWWRC) is pleased to announce the distribution of \$718,871 to 55 local agencies and programs through the General Community Fund for this quarter. The monies will fund services and programs that support basic needs, provide mental health support, and reduce isolation. The total funds requested during this application period were \$2,350,000. The demand for funding far outweighs what is presently available and the situation is becoming more critical as the cost of food, housing, and other basic needs continues to increase.

UWWRC's General Community Fund is now distributed every 3 months in order to be more responsive to community needs and provide rapid local solutions. There is an <u>open call for applications</u> quarterly to fund the most relevant programs and organizations, with a more agile and focused application process, including a stronger emphasis on equity and inclusion. All funds are raised locally and are distributed to local organizations.

During this round of applications UWWRC granted out \$182,000 from The Tomorrow Fund, an endowment fund targeted specifically to programs and organizations serving the Cambridge and North Dumfries communities. The grants from The Tomorrow Fund are focused on programs and/or organizations that address emerging or long-term community needs through new or innovative programs or to build capacity to meet those needs. Recipients of The Tomorrow Fund are noted below (**). Gifts given to the fund remain in the fund forever and only the income is used, thereby maintaining all gifts for the benefit of future generations.
