United Way facilitates distribution of \$663.371 through 2023 General Community Fund

47 local agencies funded to support and critical programs addressing issues rooted in poverty and ambivalence.

Waterloo Region – United Way Waterloo Region Communities (UWWRC) recently shared their second cycle of 2023 local community funding of \$663,371, distributed amongst 47 incredible organizations. Thanks to the generosity of donors these funds will be distributed in April to programs contributing to critical social supports, aligned with the vision of a healthy, safe, and inclusive region.

Despite ongoing social and economic challenges, which continue to affect people from all walks of life, UWWRC remains committed to mobilizing generosity and investing in community-wide solutions. The problems in our region, and around the world continue to grow and solutions are as complicated and multilayered as the issues. Funding was distributed with a lens of inclusion and consideration to the diversity of needs and geography in our region as well as through focused cause areas. This funding round saw housing and homelessness, safety and wellbeing, and mental health frontline supports as the top funded areas based on the applications received and ongoing community need.

UWWRC quarterly grants allow for agile and timely funding to a large network of local organizations for specific programs or general operating expenses. "We strive for responsive and holistic funding", says Amanda Melnick, Senior Director Impact and Stewardship. Each quarter, with the support of a group of trained volunteers, applications are reviewed and selected using segmented criterium, group review, and careful evaluation. Community members are urged to support the united effort to enhance quality of life in our region. We are in this together. **Without you, there is no way.**
