# **Third Quarter United Way WRC Funding Announcement**

Community Funding Announced, with 2023 Campaign Goal of \$8 Million Dollars to Meet the Growing Need

**Waterloo Region** - United Way Waterloo Region Communities is pleased to announce the distribution of \$699,615, to 58 local community organizations and programs this quarter. The 88 applications received totalled over \$2.4 million in funding requests, and as a result only 29% of the total community need was able to be addressed.

This funding announcement came only a few days after United Way officially announced the \$8 million dollar campaign goal for 2023. "\$8 million is the minimum needed by our community's vital non-profit sector to properly address the existing funding shortage," stated Joan Fisk, United Way WRC CEO in her remarks.

United Way WRC ensures that marginalized communities, who have been historically underfunded, are given equitable consideration. In response to a request from the community, new application accommodations have been implemented to remove identified barriers. Supporting innovative grassroots organizations is another important area of need met through United Way funding.

Observations made in reviewing the applications included staggering examples of the growing demand for services as indicated by wait-list data and need for affordable housing. The Sexual Assault Support Centre sited a waitlist of more than 300 waiting for counselling. The Child Witness Center (CWC) reported having to start a waitlist for the first time in their 40-year history. There are currently 197 young people who are waiting for CWC services.

"Even with addressing one third of the requests, we are making a difference," shared Amanda Melnick, Director of Impact and Stewardship, while Kicking off the University of Waterloo Campaign. "We are committed to do better for our community and address more of the growing need, to amplify the work that is happening on the front lines and to be a champion for those in need of a little support".

Helping others in our community is the role of United Way; however, everyone in this community plays an important role, and full support is needed to meet the need and help fill the gaps in funding. The slogan for the 2023 Campaign is 'United. Without you, there is no way."
